### Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2

NAPPER ROAD AND SMITH STREET INTERSECTION, PARKWOOD  
PROGRESSIVE TEMPORARY LANE CLOSURES AND NIGHT WORKS

**From early February 2017 work will commence on the reconstruction of the Napper Road and Smith Street intersection for the installation of the light rail tracks across Napper Road, Parkwood as part of the Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2.**

The reconstruction will take place in different stages during weeknights and on weekends that are expected to take three months to complete and will require temporary lane closures and detours, weather permitting. These works must be undertaken at night when traffic volumes are at their lowest.

Visual message boards will be located along Napper Road and Smith Street to provide information on the above closures and detours closer to work commencing.

**Night work construction activities will occur from 6.00pm to 7.00am will involve:**

- Removal of concrete islands on Napper Road to create space for lane changes during the reconstruction work.
- Asphalt removal to relocate and install electrical service conduits and pits for the signalised intersection and street lighting.
- Excavation of existing kerbs and relaying new road drainage.
- Reconstruction of the existing concrete islands on Smith Street and install the pedestrian refuge.
- Concrete work including the installation of formwork, pouring and concrete cutting.
- Installation of electrical conduits for the light rail system.
- Placement of base asphalt layer. Once the intersection infrastructure works are completed including the installation of the light rail systems, the final asphalt layer and line markings are applied.

#### What to expect:

During construction, you will notice changes around your local area such as:

- Traffic control for lane closures, diversions and detours including signage to direct motorists. In the event of wet weather or unforeseen circumstances, this activity will occur on the next available Friday through Monday.
- Visual message boards will operate in the area to keep you informed.
- Increased noise levels and vibration from machinery i.e. road saws, jackhammers, asphalt machinery, excavators, compaction equipment, concrete trucks, bobcats, vacuum excavators, site vehicles and lighting towers.
- Dust associated with construction activities, water trucks are onsite to minimise dust.

Every effort will be made to keep disruption to a minimum for residents in close proximity to these works. We appreciate your patience during these important works and will continue to update you as work progresses.

## Detour map:

Motorists are advised to avoid the area if possible during these works and seek an alternative route as delays are expected.

The detour map below is a guide to assist with access during the reconstruction works in your area.



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


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## Weekend lane closures:

## Project information

Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2 involves the design and construction of a new 7.3km route which runs from Helensvale heavy rail station adjacent to the Gold Coast Line, then adjacent to the Smith Street Motorway to connect with Stage 1 at the Gold Coast University Hospital light rail station.

GoldLinQ's construction contractor CPB Contractors commenced construction in July 2016 and are committed to completing the project in time for the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.



Trams will travel at grade (street level) across the two intersections (Napper Road and Olsen Avenue) of the Stage 2 alignment. The Gold Coast light rail currently crosses 50+ intersections at grade including along the Gold Coast Highway and through Southport and Surfers Paradise Boulevard.



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
