### Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2

#### RELOCATION OF GAS PIPELINE – PARKWOOD PARK 'N' RIDE



**During the week commencing Monday 23 May 2016, CPB Contractors will begin work on the relocation of an existing gas pipeline at the site of the future Parkwood park 'n' ride facility.**

The work will take up to two months to complete (weather permitting) and will involve the installation of a new section of high pressure gas line and decommissioning of a section of the existing line. Once complete, this work will allow for major construction to commence on the Parkwood park 'n' ride.

Work will involve:

- Survey of the work area.
- Construction of site entry points and access gates.
- Removal of vegetation to access the work area.
- Placement of temporary fencing and erosion and sediment controls.
- Excavating sections of ground using heavy machinery.
- Placement and welding of sections of a new gas pipeline onto the existing network.
- Night work to establish a primary site access point off Smith Street. This work is expected to take up to two nights to complete (see information overleaf).

All vegetation removal will be undertaken in accordance with required environmental guidelines. A fauna spotter-catcher will be on-site to survey trees and to monitor for wildlife during clearing.

## What to expect

Construction work will be undertaken between 7:00am and 6:00pm, Monday to Saturday. Workers may arrive onsite between 6.00am and 7.00am to prepare for the day's activities.

During these works, you may notice some changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel.

Every effort will be made to keep disruption to a minimum for residents and businesses in close proximity to the project site. We appreciate your patience during these important works and will continue to update you as work progresses.

## Night work – establishment of site access along Smith Street

During the week commencing Monday 23 May 2016, night work will be undertaken along Smith Street, to establish a new site access into the Parkwood park 'n' ride site. **This work will be undertaken between 8:00pm and 6:00am each night and is expected to take two nights to complete\***.

These works must be undertaken at night when traffic volumes are at their lowest. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist and direct motorists.

Night work will involve:

- Temporary single lane closure on the westbound carriageway along Smith Street, heading towards Gaven.
- The use of light vehicles, excavator and bobcat to form the new site access point.
- Using temporary lighting towers to light the work areas.

Every effort will be made to schedule the highest noise generating works to the earlier part of the evenings.

\*Should weather delay these activities, they will be undertaken on the next available week night.

## Project information

Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2 involves the design and construction of a new 7.3km route which runs from Helensvale heavy rail station adjacent to the Gold Coast Line, then adjacent to the Smith Street Motorway to connect with Stage 1 at the Gold Coast University Hospital light rail station.

In March 2016, the Queensland Government and GoldLinQ announced CPB Contractors were the preferred contractor to design and build the project in time for the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.

CPB Contractors will undertake additional information sessions and other communications activities will occur prior to major construction commencing as scheduled later in the year.
